





Criteria for the ENL class

In order for a student to enter the ENL class, he/ she should be able to:

- Understand and use a range of utility, descriptive and subject-specific words in order to describe, compare and/ or classify.
- Understand detailed sentences (including nouns, verbs, adjectives, pronouns, adverbs)
- Understand open-ended questions (why, how, tell me about...)
- Use a range of utility, descriptive and subject-specific words in order to describe, explain and / or retell.
- Use nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs with occasional word-order errors to express himself /herself.
- Manipulate word order to create positive and negative commands, statements and questions.
- Use common social expressions to compliment, apologize, show appreciation and interact with peers and adults.
