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MISSION

At CGS we strive to provide an academic setting where every student's skills and character can flourish to the fullest by encouraging meaningful connections between the classroom and real life experiences. Our students work in an environment of ongoing inquiry, cooperation and mutual respect as they acquire a high caliber education and positive life attitudes so as to make their own contribution in the world.

SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Established in 1970 and governed by a Board of Directors, CGS is one of Greece's oldest and most prestigious private schools, providing educational programs from the pre-school to the secondary school level. Located in Pallini, a northern suburb of Athens on a 67,000 m² campus, CGS has a student population of 1916. The student body is comprised primarily of Greek nationals but there is an emerging international and bi-cultural student population from North America, Europe and Asia including the UK, USA, Canada, China, Italy, Finland, Cyprus, Sweden, The Netherlands, Russia, Australia, South Africa, Argentina, Mexico, France and Switzerland.

There has also been a growing number of students transferring to CGS from public schools, with an increase of 20%. In the academic year 2022-23, there were 264 new enrollments of students coming from both public and private schools.

FACILITIES AND CAMPUS

CGS sits on a 67,000 m² campus setting, 20 km. outside downtown Athens. Set in a beautiful, green campus, students and the wider community have access to exceptional facilities:

CURRICULA

CGS is authorized to offer three International Baccalaureate programs, from pre-school to the secondary school level.

At the secondary school level, all students follow the Greek National Curriculum delivered through the IB Middle Years Program (MYP) and receive the qualification, "Apolytirio Gymnasiou" as well as the IB MYP Certificate.

During Grade 10 (A' Lyceum/IB MYP 5) students can choose to follow the Pre-IB DP program alongside their regular studies as preparation for the IB Diploma Program. This program is entirely English-taught.

For Grades 11 and 12, students decide on whether to follow the Greek National Curriculum, leading to the high school diploma, "Apolytrio Genikou Lykeiou" or the IB Diploma Program leading to the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

SUBJECTS OFFERED

Lyceum

The Lyceum program runs on a two-semester system: Fall and Summer Terms. Grades are issued in January and in June. Students who wish to be admitted to a Greek public university must sit for the National PanHellenic Examinations. In addition, they must be examined in a combination of Stream Subjects specific to their direction of study.

IB Diploma Program

The IB Diploma Program (IB DP) runs on three-semester system: Fall, Spring and Summer Terms. Grades are issued in November, March and June. Predicted grades are issued between late October and November. All IB DP students must take a total of 6 subjects: 3 Higher Level and 3 Standard Level.

To be awarded the full IB Diploma, all students must meet three additional core requirements:

- An additional class in Theory of Knowledge
- Writing a 4,000-word independent research paper, the Extended Essay
- Creativity Activity Service (CAS) a total of 150 hours in these three strands alongside their studies over two years
